For our main project, two students stayed together with a family in a rural village in the mountains on the Ugandan/ Kenyan boarder. We were able to decide what we wanted to research, and then had a week getting to walk through the village and conduct research. Because we were doing our research on agriculture in the region, we got to help collect, shuck, and process coffee beans. This class set us up to complete a 6week internship or independent study and write reports about what we chose to do. None of the classes I took directly fed into either major. However, I want to go into developmental economics and the program I was on had a set developmental studies course load.





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HOW WAS EDUCATION ABROAD DIFFERENT THAN ANTICIPATED?

The days were a lot longer than I expected. Most mornings I'd be up by 6am and usually wouldn't get home from class till between 5-7pm. The majority of our classes were field trips and really encouraged hands on learning which is very different than the normal UVA lecture. I was slightly surprised by how easy it was for me to adjust and to be able to contact friends back home.
