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# About the ISO

The International Studies Office (ISO), a division of UVA Global, is a University-wide resource which contributes to UVA's global mission through activities, programs and services designed to support the development of a globally aware, culturally diverse education and research environment. Through the International Students and Scholars Program, Education Abroad, and the Lorna Sundberg International Center, the ISO provides expertise and infrastructure to help expand and sustain global education at the University of Virginia. The ISO is also home to the CORE (Cultural Orientation, Reflection, and Engagement) Program and the Peace Corps Prep Program.

International Students and Scholars Program staff:

- provide advice and counsel to the international student and scholar community
- serve as a resource in support of international initiatives
- provide programming and services to support the adjustment and integration of international students and scholars to the U.S. and the university community

Education Abroad staff:

- guide and advise students, scholars and faculty on education abroad
- provide information about study abroad opportunities and promote cross-cultural and safety awareness
- facilitate and ensure access to education abroad for students from diverse backgrounds and students from underrepresented groups
- collaborate with University leaders, faculty, staff, and others to increase student participation in education abroad
- assist faculty and administrators in setting up study abroad programs

Lorna Sundberg International Center staff and volunteers:

- offer programs and services to enhance the experience of UVA's international students, scholars, faculty and families
- provide opportunities for intercultural enrichment for the University and the local community

The ISO is funded through the Office of the Executive Vice President and Provost. The Director reports to the Vice Provost for Global Affairs, Stephen D. Mull. The ISO is advised by the Faculty Advisory Committee on Education Abroad, the University Risk Management Committee for Education Abroad, and the International Students and Scholars Advisory Council. In addition to the College and Graduate School of Arts and Sciences and the professional schools of the University, the ISO regularly collaborates with the Division of Student Affairs, Office of Summer and Special Academic Programs, University Housing and Dining Services, University Registrar, Student Financial Services, Office of Risk Management, Office of the General Counsel, Public Affairs, University Career Services, Center for International Studies, Global Affairs Advisory Council and student associations such as Global Student Council.

The operations of the ISO are informed by the University's Statement of Purpose and Code of Ethics and core values of honor and ethics, faculty excellence, innovation and collaboration in the pursuit of knowledge, and leadership for the public good and education for freedom.

The ISO endorses the Statements of Ethics, Professional Competencies and Principles for Programs and Services developed by NAFFSA: Association of International Educators and the Standards for Good Practice adopted by the Forum on Education Abroad.

The number of international students at UVA continued to increase in 2019-20; however, the number of visiting scholars from outside the US joining the UVA community declined 10%. The decline is attributable to the outbreak of COVID-19 and subsequent pandemic and restrictions on mobility in the winter and spring of 2020. With logistical support from the Office of Engagement, the ISO offered the UVA Express program fall 2019 to entering undergraduates and exchange students. ISO continues to partner with CAPS (Counseling and Psychological Services at UVA) to offer a monthly support group called Global Bridges, and to co-facilitate a longstanding bi-weekly support group for undergraduate and graduate international students and scholars. The International Students and Scholars Program with support from ITS implemented new software, Terra Dotta, to integrate UVA information systems and provide a dependable, secure interface with SEVIS. The new system supports better management of student data and monitoring for compliance. The major user benefits are:

- Students and scholars can schedule one-on-one appointments with ISO Advisors through ISSP Connect (Terra Dotta) and Zoom.
- Students and scholars can submit immigration requests online through ISSP Connect and are able to see the status of their requests (pending, approved)
- Advisors can pull reports based on student or scholar requests. For example, ISSP can pull a report to see how many students have completed the Immigration Check-in form, or how many students have an active I-20 studying Business.
- ISSP Connect also has an assessment feature that quizzes student on their understanding of the online orientation. The International Student Orientation module was moved to ISSP Connect to tie to the immigration check-in for Fall 2020.
- Departmental administrators can view the current status of all visiting scholars hosted by their departments and make requests directly online.





In the Open Doors 2019 report published by the Institute for International Education (IIE), UVA ranks 16th among U.S. universities for the number of students awarded credit for education abroad. This is the fifth year that UVA has made the top 25, a list mostly populated by much larger institutions. Although no students traveled abroad for spring break or summer, there were still 1,273 UVA students who went abroad during other terms. There was a record-breaking number of applications to January term programs in 2020. A total of 413 students studied abroad in January 2020 and more than 100 students who completed an application were not able to participate because there was not enough program capacity to meet the demand, despite the addition of new programs in Vietnam and Kenya.

The UVA in Valencia program host its first UVA Global First Program and introduced English taught Pre-Health courses in the fall of 2019. The fall Pre-Health track is geared toward Valencia First students and transfer students during their first semester at UVA and consists of the first semester Biology, Chemistry, and Calculus courses. The program expanded the Pre-Health program to the spring semester with Biology, Chemistry, and Statistics courses that are generally taken during the spring semester of a student's second year.

Summer 2020 was on track to offer nine new faculty-led programs, including engineering programs in Greece and Lithuania, internship programs in Belgium and India, and other field study, practicum, and community engagement programs in India, Mexico, Morocco, Nepal, and the Philippines.

Instead, the new academic Virtual Global Internship program was developed to offer several students who were planning to intern abroad in summer 2020 the chance to extend their relationships with "the global" through remote internships and participation in the Global Studies course, "Interning Abroad in Virtual Conditions." Thirteen students completed 8- to 10-week internships with four international organizations (most of which were not-for-profits) located in Morocco, India, Thailand, and Peru.

Finally, a record number of UVA students applied for and were awarded scholarships to study abroad. For Fall 2019/Year 2019-2020, 19 recipients were awarded 28 ISO-administered scholarships, totaling \$51,850; in Spring 2020, 30 recipients were awarded 44 ISO-administered scholarships, totaling \$85,343; and for Summer 2020 (prior to the cancellation due to Covid-19), 93 recipients were slated to receive 133 ISO-administered scholarships, totaling \$210,350. Five students received the Gilman scholarship, one student is an alternate, and one student received the Gilman-McCain scholarship.

## SUSPENSION OF EDUCATION ABROAD DUE TO THE CORONAVIRUS PANDEMIC

With the 2020 coronavirus pandemic, international education and exchange at UVA and at institutions across the United States and abroad saw an unprecedented suspension of spring semester activities. With spring semester academic programming largely shifted online by mid-March, an ambitious effort was undertaken to repatriate students home within a period of weeks. University leadership recognized ISO staff, colleagues across the University and among partner universities and provider organizations who helped nearly 400 students return or transition into quarantine conditions safely.

(Note: The following numbers reflect students who enrolled or registered with ISO for Spring, Summer, and Fall semesters in 2020. In some cases, the same student was registered for multiple programs in multiple semesters. Summer and Fall semesters also do not reflect students who changed or abandoned plans before enrolling or registering.)









The International Center (IC) continued to meet a need for short-term lodgings for international visitors, meeting space for UVA departments and organizations' cultural events, and English language programs for UVA and community members. Each month, the IC hosted multiple social and cultural programs including interactive activities, cooking classes, workshops, and local outings. Large special events this year included the annual Mary Ellen Brown Family Picnic and the Holiday Lights Celebration. The IC collaborated with 36 volunteers for a total of 241 hours to organize and implement these programs.

Due to the pandemic and the University's operational changes starting in March, the number of program participants, space users, and lodging guests the center typically engages with in the spring semester decreased. Most programs and reservations in March were cancelled, and, in April and May, only online programs were held and all space and lodging reservations were cancelled.

Erwin Wijaya from Indonesia and Lihong (Mary) Peng from China were awarded the 2020 Lorna Sundberg Scholarship for their academic achievement, leadership, and commitment to volunteerism.

Each month, approximately **6,600** members of the UVA and Charlottesville community receive the IC newsletter.

In the annual programming survey, 76% of the respondents strongly agreed and 24% agreed that the IC provided a comfortable and welcoming environment for them to share their own cultures and to learn about other cultures.

# *Cultural Orientation, Reflection, and Engagement*

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In 2010, UVA Education Abroad staff and faculty together developed a set of learning goals in intercultural understanding, reflection, and communication for undergraduates who study, conduct research, and work abroad. From this initiative, culture-specific courses, workshops, and modules have been created for individual programs, and the highly-praised and flexible CORE curriculum, taught by advanced graduate students in the cultural humanities and social sciences, is offered every semester to anyone spending at least 3 weeks abroad.

For 2019-20, up to 200 students were expected and planning to participate in a range of offerings. But with the exception of atypical cohort of 22 students in fall and early spring, the suspensions and cancellations to in-situ study brought about by the coronavirus pandemic resulted in CORE and related summer courses being put on hold. We look forward to reviving this vibrant part of the UVA Education Abroad experience when international travel safely resumes.

Launched in August 2016, the UVA Peace Corps Prep program prepares undergraduates for international development fieldwork and potential Peace Corps service. Students admitted to the program build the following four core competencies through interrelated coursework, hands-on experience, and professional development support:

- Sector-specific skills
- Foreign language proficiency
- Intercultural competence
- Professional savvy and leadership

Upon completion of the program, participants receive a certificate from the Peace Corps—and a competitive edge when applying for Peace Corps service.

# Student Awards & Honors

Students and alumni at UVA received numerous awards throughout the year to pursue their education and research abroad. They work with the ISO, Office of Citizen Scholar Development (OCSD), other University offices, and external agencies during their application process. Some notable awards students and alumni received in 2019-20 were the Benjamin A. Gilman, Schwarzman, Rhodes, and the Ford Foundation scholarships. This year, OCSD reported that 22 UVA alumni and graduate students received Fulbright Scholarships. Through these esteemed awards, students will have the opportunity to engage in programs in countries around the world, such as China, South Africa, Cuba, and Peru.
